Request: Mr. Mesa has submitted a letter dated June 19, 2011, requesting an extension of the payment arrangements pursuant his promissory note for retirement service credit.

Discussion:

The member executed a Retirement Fund promissory note # 3793 on June 29, 2004, to claim redeposit service credit for government of Guam employment from Feb. 1974 through Dec. 1978. The term of the note was to be effective July 24, 2004 with a completion date of July 02, 2011.

During a scheduled meeting with a benefit specialist this March for a service and annuity benefit analysis, it was identified that the arranged payment plan commencement date of July 24, 2004 did not occur until March 01, 2008. The delay has resulted in almost four years of missed payroll deductions which prompted Mr. Mesa's request for an extension of the promissory note completion date, citing financial hardship in the event the Fund asks for full payment of the note balance.

The following provisions are referenced from the guidebook Regulations Concerning Claims To Obtain Service Credits, Chapter IV- Installment Payment Agreements;

❖ §4.3 Bilateral Amendment of Note. An existing promissory note may be amended upon written request of a member and approval by a duly authorized representative of the Fund or vice versa. Form GGRF 9489(a), "Promissory Note Addendum Request", has been developed for this purpose.

Such amendments must be fully in conformance to existing rules and/or laws, as may be amended, and will be effective only when properly received and approved by the Fund.

❖ §4.4 Periodic Reviews. During the term of any payment arrangement inclusive of promissory notes, the Fund is authorized to review each member's account to ensure adherence to the agreed payroll deduction plan. Where a member's account is found not to be in agreement with the authorized plan, the Fund shall have the right to demand payment within 30 days from the date of written notification to bring the account to its proper balance. Failure by the member to comply with a written demand for payment under the terms and conditions of the promissory note shall be deemed as a breach of such note and may result in forfeiture of the service claim.

Excerpt from the Retirement Fund promissory note Terms and Conditions statements;

- ❖ 1. The member shall be solely responsible to make all necessary arrangements with his/her employing agency/department to implement the above bi-weekly payroll deductions and to ensure the timely remittal of such deductions to the Retirement Fund;
- ❖ 3. The member shall be deemed to be in default of this agreement and shall forfeit his/her right to the credit being sought herewith if, prior to making the final payment:
 - A. He/She terminates or disrupts his/her payroll deductions for any reason other than administrative error;

Staff Recommendation:

The following are options for consideration which are within statute authority:

1. With recognition that the request was filed prior to the promissory note completion date, grant the extension pursuant to §4.3 Bilateral Amendment of Note, and extend the payment plan term equal to the period of missed payments with a recalculation of the promissory note interest amount due at the new completion date.
