V. REVIEW AND FINDINGS (Correspondences)

1. COR 06-10 RE: Jerry W. Taylor - (Margaret C. Taylor, Deceased Retiree - July 23, 2006)

Request:

Application for Adult Disabled Survivor Benefits pursuant to §8134© Title 4, Chapter 8 GCA

Discussion:

The language pertinent to the aforementioned provision is presented below:

"Payment to Children Disabled Before Eighteen (18) Years. Upon death of an annuitant, or a member while in service having completed at least three (3) years of total service, if a surviving child or children is disabled, annuities shall be payable to them after age eighteen (18) at the same annual rate as if they were minor children under the age of eighteen (18); provided however, that such annuity shall be conditional upon the child being disabled prior to the child's eighteenth (18FNth) birthday and having been examined by two (2) licensed physicians before attaining the age of eighteen (18), or within one (1) year of the death of the annuitant or member, and found to be permanently physically or mentally disabled and incapable of self-support. The results of such examination may be submitted to the Board at any time prior to the child's eighteenth (18FNth) birthday, or within one (1) year of the death of the annuitant or member."

A review of the medical examination report reveals the physician's conclusion that Mr. Jerry W. Taylor is not disabled and is capable of self-supporting.

Addendum:

At the Members & Benefit's Committee meeting of January 17, 2007, committee members requested a clarification of the physician's conclusion on the medical examination report with regards to Mr. Jerry W. Taylor's permanent disability status in relation to being self-supporting. The fund is in receipt of Dr. Muhammad R. Javed's letter dated April 03, 2007 which clarifies his findings presented on the medical examination report previously submitted.

Findings:

Mr. Taylor is eligible for disabled survivor benefits pursuant to the statute therefore, we recommend APPROVAL of this request.

2. COR 06-11 RE: Rosita S. Lizama, Retired September 27, 1991

Request:

Mrs. Lizama has submitted her appeal pursuant to §8122.2, in response to the Fund's proposal to adjust her annuity benefits due to a payroll adjustment error in processing retroactive payments.

Discussion:

The proposed adjustment is as a result of a recent audit of the payroll history discrepancies of the annuity calculations versus the actual annuity paid to Mrs. Lizama upon retirement in September 1991.

The entitled semi-monthly gross annuity was calculated at \$714.58. However, for the payroll period of 12/15/91, a retroactive payment adjustment totaling \$125.33 was added to the \$714.58 semi-monthly annuity for a gross payment of \$839.91.

The semi-monthly gross of \$714.58 was to be reverted in the succeeding payroll period of 12/31/91 and thereafter. This adjustment did not take effect and continued to date. Subsequently, Mrs. Lizama was notified of these circumstances and findings in a letter dated February 22, 2007.

An audit of Mrs. Lizama's file does not provide documents or evidence of internal disclosure or prior notification regarding overpayment of annuity benefits.

The summary provision of §8122.1. Adjustments. (a), (b), (1), (2), (3), stipulate that should an error occur in computing a benefit, recovery of such benefits may not be made if the error was not as a result of information provided by the member, the member did not have reasonable grounds to

believe that benefits were in error, and the incorrect benefit was paid four (4) years or more before the member was notified of the error.

The summary provision of §8122.2. Waiver of Adjustments. (a),(1),(2),(3), provide that upon appeal by the affected member, the Board may waive an adjustment or any portion of an adjustment if it is the opinion of the Board that the adjustment will cause undo hardship to the member, the adjustment was not the result of erroneous information supplied by the member, the member had no reasonable grounds to believe the records were incorrect or a mistake occurred before the adjustment was made.

Staff Recommendation:

A review has established that the error was administrative and was not as a result of any contributing factors by the member. Thus, the Committee may consider the foregoing recommendations on the appeal for waiver of adjustments.

- 1. Deny the appeal on the basis that no recovery of overpaid benefits is demanded and adjustments to benefits will be prospective.
- 2. Grant the appeal based on the summary findings and statute authority.
- 3. Request that the member present justification that the adjustment will cause undo hardship.
- 4. The Committee may conduct a hearing on the appeal request.
- 5. The Committee may impose conditions on granting a waiver which it deems or considers equitable.

Findings:

A review has established that the error was administrative and was not a result of any contributing factors by the member. Thus, the committee recommends **APPROVAL** of the appeal as it applies to proposal number 2 above.
