A. Presentation from Attorney Joyce Tang

Ms. Joyce Tang from the Law Firm of Teker Civille Torres & Tang, made a brief presentation to the Board of Trustees on the business of security fraud. The firm's area of specialty is in security fraud litigation. This is a class action lawsuit that won't cost the Retirement Fund any money. There's no retainer. It will be on a contingency basis. If you own stock, all you have to do is participate or join the lawsuit before the case is settled. Chairman Salas recommended that this proposal should go before the Investment Committee.

Chairman Salas asked if this involves any other securities other than stocks. Ms. Tang replied yes. Vince Camacho, BenefitsCorp stated that the Board of Trustees doesn't necessarily make decisions to purchase individual stocks. The Board only chooses the investment manager. The investment manager makes the determination on which individual stocks or bonds to purchase. Ms. Tang stated that it doesn't matter who purchased or who recommended purchasing the stock. It's who owns it. Vice Chairman Cruz inquired about Enron. Ms. Tang stated that they are not suing Enron. They are going after the underwriters.

Chairman Salas thanked Ms. Tang for her presentation. Director Aflague suggested referring this matter to the next Investment Committee Meeting then the Board of Trustees could take action on an RFP.

Vice Chairman Gerard Cruz stated that the Minutes of June 16, 2003 and the Minutes of August 6 & 7, 2003 are submitted for the Board of Trustees' review. Vice Chairman Cruz stated that the Investment Managers' Review was very successful.

Vice Chairman Cruz stated that the asset allocation is 50% U.S. Fixed Income, 40% U.S. Equity, and 10% Non U.S. Equity. Vice Chairman Cruz stated that we need to put in place an interim allocation. Mr. Pete Tajalle stated that the expected return on option A4a would be 7.51% and the return on option A4b will be 7.83%. Mr. Tajalle stated that he recommends the adoption of option A4a. Mrs. Rolenda Faasuamalie stated that we should set forth with the RFP. Mr. Tajalle stated that we would need the Board's approval for the allocation then to develop the RFP.

On motion of Vice Chairman Gerard Cruz, seconded by Mrs. Rolenda Faasuamalie, and unanimously agreed upon, the Board of Trustees voted to approve to move forward with an RFP process for Broad International Developed Markets Small Cap and Developed Markets Large Cap with the condition of proper input from Legal Counsel and from our investment consultants. Motion carried.

VI. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A. Disability Applicants

Ms. Paula Bamba stated that on April 23, 2003, the first meeting of the new Board of Trustees, approved disability retirement annuities for five (5) applicants. The commencement date was the date of the Board's approval. Ms. Bamba inquired if the commencement date should be the date of the Board's approval or the date when the individual exhausted his/her sick leave. Ms. Bamba stated that the applications were not entertained earlier due to the absence of the Board of Trustees. Some of these applicants were ready for the Board's approval since December 2002. Ms. Bamba stated that she has inquired with Legal Counsel if these applicants are entitled to retroactive pay. Ms. Bamba asked if these applicants should receive retroactive payment from when they were ready to go before the Board. Legal Counsel's recommendation is that the Board of Trustees have the authority to approve a disability application with a retroactive commencement date.

Mrs. Rolenda Faasuamalie asked who are the disability applicants that were affected by waiting for the Board to be in place. Mrs. Faasuamalie stated that she would like to review the documentation. Mrs. Faasuamalie further stated that she would like the commencement date to be the date of the next regularly scheduled Board of Trustees meeting. The resignation of the previous Board was effective January 6, 2003. The next regularly scheduled meeting would have been on the latter part of January 2003.

Vice Chairman Gerard Cruz asked how much money are we anticipating with the retroactive payments. Mr. Greg Perez, Acting Benefits Program Administrator, stated that it would be retroactive for three months. Director Aflague stated that he will get the details of each of the five applicants to include the dollar amount. Vice Chairman Cruz asked what happens if this situation should come up again where there's no Board of Trustees available to conduct a meeting. Ms. Bamba stated that with Bill 153, this would not happen again. There should always be a Board in place.

B. Contributions Update

Director Aflague reported to the Board of Trustees that two other agencies are now eligible for their employees to apply for retirement. The Department of Customs and Quarantine, and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse are now current with their contributions. There are a total of nine line agencies that are now current with their payments.

Director Aflague mentioned a couple of newspaper articles affecting the Retirement Fund. The first article was regarding the AG's lawsuit against DOA. This lawsuit has been dropped. Director Aflague stated that the line agencies are current at this time with their remittance of their employee/employer contributions with the exception of DOE and GMH. Director Aflague stated that DOE is aware that they are behind \$16 Million. The Attorney General will be going after DOE to make some movement on behalf of the Retirement Fund.

The other article was an incident at GMH regarding three GMH employees in the payroll division with regards to not remitting their personal share of employee contributions. Director Aflague informed the Board of Trustees that he will be establishing a quality assurance division.

C. Budget Bill

Director Aflague reported to the Board of Trustees that there are several items in the budget bill that pertains to the Retirement Fund. Vice Speaker Aguon is proposing to insert a provision to allow employees to retire if their individual employee/employer contributions have been remitted by their agencies. Director Aflague further stated that there are new provisions where the autonomous agencies are being asked to pay the health, dental and life insurance premiums for their respective retirees and no longer from the General Fund.

Chairman Salas requested that any recommendation for legislation should go before the Board of Trustees especially on policy making decisions.

VII. OLD BUSINESS

A. Financial Report

1. Accounts Receivable

Mr. Pete Tajalle, Controller, reported to the Board of Trustees on the outstanding receivables. As of August 8, 2003, the General Fund has paid \$2.3 Million of their \$4.3 Million outstanding receivables. Their balance due as of August 8, 2003 is \$2,091,100.50. The three biggest agencies that owe the Retirement Fund money are the General Fund, DOE with \$16,512,511.91 for employee/employer contributions and interest and penalties, and GMH at \$16,044,399.90 for employee/employer contributions and interest and penalties. Mr. Tajalle stated that he will continue with our collection efforts. Mr. Tajalle further stated that they are also working with collection for supplemental outstanding receivables from GPA and the Port Authority.

Vice Chairman Cruz asked where do benefit payments to retirees reflect in the income statement. Mr. Tajalle stated that it is not included as an actual expense of the Fund. That represents an annuity pay out based on whatever their benefits is due to them at that particular time. It would be just a reduction of the liability to the actual annuitant itself. It is not an expense of the Fund.

B. Salary Adjustment for Director

Chairman Salas stated that Item VII B has been tabled for several months. Director Aflague is requesting for the Board of Trustees approval for a salary adjustment from Step 5 to Step 10, a 20% increase in salary. Chairman Salas stated that he would recommend approving the salary adjustment to Step 10 for the reasons that he is a director that is tasked with some very significant challenges throughout the Government of Guam.

Ms. Katherine Taitano asked why the Director was at Step 5. Ms. Paula Bamba stated that Step 5 is the entry level established by the Civil Service Commission.

Mrs. Rolenda Faasuamalie stated that the salary adjustment was entertained at the first meeting of the new Board. Mr. Aflague has done really well and we all can see the progress.

Vice Chairman Gerard Cruz stated that he sees the progress that would justify the salary adjustment. Vice Chairman Cruz stated that he is very impressed with how we were able to get the receivables down to a level that's more manageable. He is still apprehensive of the timing of this issue. Vice Chairman Cruz stated that he is in support of the salary adjustment.

Chairman Salas stated that the Board is very supportive of the salary adjustment to Step 10. Chairman Salas stated that as required by law, we have to have a six (6) month performance review from time to time.

Director Aflague stated that his commitment to the Board is that his salary level will stay at Step 10 but that his performance level will increase through Steps 11-20. Chairman Salas stated that the salary adjustment should be retroactive to the date of hiring.

Vice Chairman Cruz made a comment that any controversy on the salary adjustment should not cloud the good of the Retirement Fund. Chairman Salas recommended directing any comments to him.

On motion of Mrs. Rolenda Faasuamalie, seconded by Ms. Katherine Taitano, and unanimously agreed upon, the Board of Trustees voted to approve the salary adjustment for the Director to Step 10, retroactive to the date of hire. Motion carried.

C. Bill 153 (Legislation Relative to the Appointment and Election of the Board of Trustees)

Ms. Paula Bamba stated that Bill 153 will be heard in session sometime next week. Senator Toni Sanford incorporated the rules and regulations as part of the actual statute and had a public hearing on it to meet the requirements of the Administrative Adjudication Act. Ms. Bamba stated that she anticipates that changes would be made because it doesn't seem to be a consensus between GARP and the senators as far as what GARP wants and what the senators want. Ms. Bamba stated that the way we handled vacancies here was a succession type of process.

Ms. Bamba stated that the Guam Election Commission will handle the election. The Retirement Fund will pay for the costs of the election. Mr. Tajalle stated that the costs, based on the Guam Election Commission estimates, will roughly be \$100,000.00 or more.

Mr. Tajalle stated that if a person who is an elected active member should become a retiree, he would have to vacate that position. Ms. Bamba stated that she is trying to get legal opinion on status as an active member who them becomes a retiree.

Chairman Salas stated that he is disappointed that there was no notification to the Board of Trustees of the public hearing on Bill 153. This should have been brought up before the Board of Trustees. Chairman Salas recommended that we need to work on measures or steps to keep the communication lines open with our oversight chair or any senator on what's coming up affecting the Retirement Fund. Vice Chairman Gerard Cruz asked if Bill 153 is as marked up. The Director replied yes.

Ms. Katherine Taitano asked if we are required to fill the vacancies. Ms. Bamba stated that we need a minimum of four (4) positive votes to pass any action. We are not required now to have four (4) positive votes. There will be no courtesy resignations required from the four (4) elected Board of Trustees.

VIII. OPEN DISCUSSION

A. First Retirement Fund Summit

Chairman Salas thanked everyone for a fine job on the summit. The feedback was that it was an overwhelming great summit. The Chairman praised the Director on his presentation at the summit.

B. Board of Trustees Meeting Time

Mrs. Rolenda Faasuamalie recommended for the Board's consideration on moving the meeting time to either 4:00 – 4:30 p.m. or to 12:00 Noon to 1:00 p.m. time frame. Chairman Salas stated that our future meetings will be conducted from 12:00 Noon to 1:00 p.m.

C. Acting Deputy Director

Chairman Salas and the Board of Trustees congratulated Ms. Paula Bamba on her nomination as Acting Deputy Director for the Retirement Fund.

Mrs. Rolenda Faasuamalie inquired about the attorney fees in the amount of \$120,000.00 for Attorney Phil Torres. Is there any response from Legal Counsel? Chairman Salas stated that there's a challenge from our Legal Counsel about substantiating the fees. The Director stated that the one of the plaintiffs in the case is an attorney with the firm that is charging the attorney fees. The Director stated that Retirement Fund's Legal Counsel has requested for a breakdown of the charges.
